

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Art Intent

At St Walburga's Catholic Primary school, we value Art as an important part of the children's entitlement to a broad, balanced curriculum.

Our Art curriculum provides children with opportunities to develop their skills using a range of material and media. Children learn the skills of drawing, painting, printing, collage, 3D work, exploration and evaluation. Sketch books are used to develop and share children's ideas. Children are encouraged to work independently but also in group collaborations to create artistic pieces on both small and large scales which are celebrated in displays around the school.

Our Art curriculum engages, inspires and challenges pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. Through our whole school cross-curricular approach children are able to make meaningful links with their learning, building on their prior knowledge.
